Unfortunately, students will not be permitted to wear costumes to school this year. We will celebrate Halloween by wearing orange and black instead.

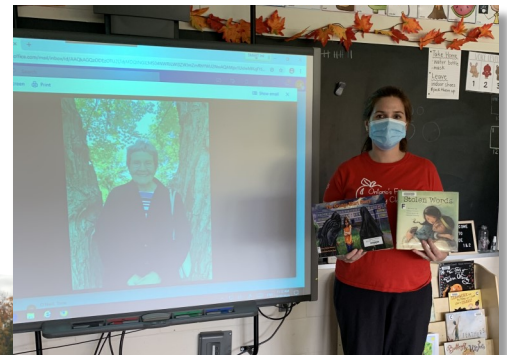
We would also like to remind families that we do have students with peanut/nut allergies, so please only send peanut free/nut free treats with your child.
